ITINERARY

Day One: Wednesday, April 5
Depart Toronto for Paris, France.

Day Two: Thursday, April 6

Upon your arrival in Paris we will be shuttled to the hotel. Tour the local area and visit the local Museum in Flanders Field. Meet and greet supper in Ypres, followed by the playing of Last Post ceremony at Menin Gate.

Day Three: Friday, April 7

Today we will explore Mons, the site of the first battle fought by the British Army in World War I on August 23rd and 24th. The British were forced to retreat and the town was occupied by the Germans until its liberation by the Canadian Corps during the final days of the war.

Day Four: Saturday, April 8

Throughout today we will witness the battle site of the Somme, Beaumont Hamel. It was at Beaumont Hamel that the Newfoundland Regiment and others attacked the German position known as the Y Ravine and within minutes lost 710 men to the German Machine Gun Located there.

Day Five: Sunday, April 9

This day is dedicated to the Battle of Vimy Ridge, an outstanding Canadian Victory in World War I. The battle which begun April 9th, 1917, marks the first time all four divisions of the Canadian Expeditionary Force participated in the battle together, and has since become the symbol of Canadian nationalistic achievement and sacrifice.



Day Six: Monday, April 10

This morning after breakfast we check out of the hotel and we drive to the Normandy Coast line. If time permits we will be exploring the picturesque beaches of Dieppe, the scene of Canada's darkest day in World War II.

Day Seven: Tuesday, April 11

This morning we will visit the Juno Beach Memorial Centre, we continue to the Beny Sur Mere War Cemetery surrounded by peaceful groves of pine and maple trees.

Day Eight: Wednesday, April 12

This morning will start with a visit to the 11th Century Abbaye D'Ardenne and the memorial to the 20 Canadian soldiers who were illegally executed by the SS Troops. We will then be off to Arromanches to explore and enjoy the town, with an impressive 360 degree film of Normandy as it reflects the history of the beautiful coastline.

Day Nine: Thursday, April 13

On this morning we will visit the American Cemetery on Omaha Beach and pay our respects to our comrades.

Day Ten: Friday, April 14

Stop at the Pegasus Bridge. This important strategic position was assaulted by the British 6th Airborne Paratroopers with amazing precision in the early morning hours on June 6th. After a short 2 hour drive to Paris, we start the end of our incredible journey through the history of World War I and II.

Day Eleven: Saturday, April 15

On our final tour day, enjoy a walking tour with guides touring the historic sites. Stops will include the Eglise Notre Dame, Eiffel Tower and the Arc de Triomphe. End the day with a farewell dinner and a 3 hour scenic cruise on the Seine.

Day Twelve: Sunday, April 16

After breakfast we make our way to the airport for our journey home back to Canada.
